Southwest Memorial Hospital Begins Campaign for New Hospital, Goes to Voters In November



The Montezuma County Hospital District Board of Directors has approved a referendum to be placed on the November 2015 ballot. Voters will be asked to approve a sales and use tax that will be used for new facility construction and improvements on the Southwest Memorial Hospital campus.

Proposed construction includes a new state-of-the-art inpatient wing to provide a higher level of healthcare, utilize leading edge medical technology, increase efficiency, and improve safety and security. In addition to the new wing, Southwest Health System clinics, currently located in several offices throughout Cortez, would be consolidated on the main campus location. This office space would offer patients one convenient location for primary care and diagnostic services. Also included in the plan is a new Emergency Medical Services (EMS) station to allow for development of new community EMS services beyond those currently offered.

The Joint Commission seeks to continuously improve health care for the public by evaluating healthcare organizations and inspiring them to excel in providing safe and effective care of the highest quality and value. It is an independent, nonprofit organization, and is the nation's oldest and largest standards-setting and accrediting body in healthcare.

To earn this accreditation, MMH underwent an unannounced, extensive four-day, on-site review by a team of three Joint Commission surveyors. During the review, the team assessed its compliance with hospital standards related to several areas, including emergency management, environment of care, infection prevention and control, leadership, and medication management. Surveyors also conducted on-site observations and interviews.

Because the standards are regarded as the most rigorous in the industry, MMH chooses to be evaluated by The Joint Commission every three years and is committed to providing the highest level of quality care for patients. Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval[®] is a clear symbol of MMH's dedication to the most stringent standards of performance.
