
Join Fellow Hospital and Healthcare Organizations for Three Days of Networking and Education for Members at Western Healthcare Alliance Annual Summit

It's all about communication, whether we are talking about teamwork, conflict resolution or leadership in general. Self-awareness is the first step, to understand and make best use of our natural traits and gifts. Montezuma County Hospital District Receives \$2m Funds to Improve Southwest Memorial Hospital



The Montezuma County Hospital District (MCHD) has received a grant award in the amount of \$2,000,000 from the Department of Local Affairs for Energy and Mineral Impact assistance funds. The grant will assist in funding for the capital improvement project for Southwest Health System (SHS) to construct a new inpatient wing, EMS station, upgraded Emergency Department facilities, and a medical office building facility. In November of 2015, ballot initiative 5A passed allowing MCHD to collect 4 cents on every \$10 of non-exempt purchases in Montezuma County, beginning in 2016 for a total of 15 years.

SHS operates Southwest Memorial Hospital and nine affiliated out-patient clinics in Montezuma County and employs over 400 people, including all members of the senior management team. State-of-the-art facilities will allow SHS to continue to provide excellent healthcare to the community while focusing on wellness and prevention and bring the best medical providers, specialists, and healthcare services to Montezuma County.
